Railroad Saddle draft EA

Following an overview presentation of the draft EA, the Coalition will discuss whether it wishes to submit comments to Forest Service and, if so, what those comments should be. The threshold for that decision will be consensus minus 1. Comments are due by February 7.

The EA and relevant project documents are available at the <u>project's webpage</u>. There is also a <u>Story Map</u> showing the proposed treatments described in the EA. (Note: If you click on the "Comment Period" folder and nothing happens, try right-clicking on the folder, opening it in a new tab, and then click on the folder to view and open its contents. Alternatively, you can click the "Download" button, download the entire zip file to your computer, and then open it.)

To gauge whether the EA is consistent with PFC's recommendations, they along with the Coalition's proposed action comment letter can be seen in the PFC <u>Project Document Library</u>. The revised recommendations (submitted 4/21/21) for restoration projects contained within the five watersheds included in the LCBC project are found under Cold July.
